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## Making Sentences More Interesting

Sentences can be made more interesting by adding verbs, adjectives and adverbs.

- Noun a naming word (e.g. cat, house, bed)
- Verb a doing word (e.g. run, talk, eat)
- Adjective a describing word (e.g. huge, green, polite)
- Adverb a word that describes a verb (e.g. quickly, slowly, happily)

Try adding but, because or and to make the sentence longer.

Make these short, simple sentences more interesting. You can replace the boring words with more interesting ones.
